

| Day 1  | Sing the Jolly Phonics songs. Use sound flash cards and point to them as you sing. Have your child practice writing their name.  | Count to 30 with your child. | Day 2  | Ask your child to name a word that rhymes with: cat, stop, pan, rug, net, and pig. Have your child practice writing their name.  | Help your child count 20 objects by touching just one item at a time. You could count buttons, coins, etc.   | Go on a nature scavenger<br>hunt in your back yard. Can<br>you find: a twig, a leaf, a<br>flower, and an insect?  |
| Day 3  | Syllable Clapping- Ask your child to clap and count how many syllables are in these words: hippo, alligator, bird, elephant, puppy, cat, rhinoceros, flamingo, zebra, cow. | Shape Hunt. Ask your child to<br>find examples of these shapes<br>around the house or yard:<br>circle, square, triangle,<br>rectangle, oval, and diamond.                | Play a game with a small toy. Ask your child to put it- over their head, under their chin, behind their back, between their knees, on their lap, and beside their foot. |
| Day 4  | Read a book with your child. Ask them questions: Who are the characters? What happened in the story? What do you think will happen next?                                   | Count to 30 with your child. Have your child draw a picture with: 1 sun, 3 trees, and 5 flowers. Ask them how many things they drew in all and help them count them- (9) | Help your child practice<br>learning their address and the<br>emergency phone number<br>(000). Talk about what to do<br>in an emergency.                                |
| Day 5  | Have your child practice writing their name. Write a random letter on paper. See if your child can name the letter and the sound it makes. Do this for 10 letters.         | Search around the house for<br>something: longer than a<br>pencil, shorter than your<br>shoe, heavier than a book,<br>and lighter than a pillow.                         | Play "I Spy" with your child.<br>Give them clues and see if<br>they can figure out what you<br>see.   |

They can also search in a magazine or book for numbers.                            | Fine Motor Fun- Give your child some playdoh and have them roll it out like a snake. | Day 4                               | Play the animal alphabet game. Name a letter and sound and see if your child can think of an animal that begins with it. (Ex.
