Melrose Primary School is an innovative design with all classrooms under one roof surrounding a central library, art room and multipurpose room. The grounds are expansive with an oval, three playgrounds and a range of courts and quiet play areas with many trees, gardens and lawned areas. We also provide activities and social support programs at break times allowing the students to have a range of options to develop their social and emotional play.

At Melrose, we value all parents/carers as partners in learning. All decision making at the school is built upon shared values and beliefs to ensure that all stakeholders in the school community have input. Our mission at Melrose is "Educating Hearts and Minds". We recognise that developing the social,

emotional and academic skills of children is of equal importance. CURRICULUM

LITERACY

At Melrose Primary School, we use evidence based teaching approaches to maximise student learning outcomes. In our learning environments, you will see the use of the gradual release teaching approach which supports the needs of our students and allows them to have greater control of their learning. We utilise the Victorian Curriculum to guide our planning of engaging learning experiences.

Students participate in rich Literacy experiences including daily independent reading practice using just right books. Our classroom libraries across the school feature non-fiction and fiction texts. Students at Melrose also participate in regular writing practice where they are developing their writing craft and a love of writing.

NUMERACY

At Melrose we provide a numeracy curriculum that engages students and inspires a love of mathematics. We do this by developing open-ended and hands on tasks that challenge our students thinking, whilst also building their capabilities at a level appropriate to each individual child. We encourage students to use materials to guide them to solve numeracy problems and support a collaborative environment where students are learning with and from each other. Melrose mathematicians are enthusiastic about numeracy and work to understand their own abilities to further develop their skills. At Melrose we see how integral a comprehensive numeracy understanding is and value the importance of equipping our students with the knowledge they need to guide their future careers and pathways.

DISCOVERY

Discovery at Melrose is learning about the 5P's. **People**, **Places** and **Processes** of the **Past** and **Present**.

Discovery is a broad subject which gives students from Foundation to Year 6 an opportunity to explore many different areas of the Victorian Curriculum. These areas include; geography, history, science, the arts, civics and citizenship, culture, environmental sustainability and digital technology.

Through Discovery, we encourage students at Melrose to see themselves as explorers, scientists, historians, researchers, creators and thinkers who actively contribute to the community, care for the environment and respect different cultures and beliefs.

EQ - EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE

Emotional Intelligence (EQ) is the ability to use emotions effectively and productively. Current research in education and psychology confirms the benefits of teaching social and emotional skills in schools, including clear links between emotional intelligence and academic achievement.

The Melrose EQ curriculum is made up of 3 Pillars: **Know Yourself** (understanding our own and others' emotions), **Choose Yourself** (making strong choices to be your best self) and **Give of Yourself** (helping to create a better world through kindness and empathy). EQ language guided by the PITW Philosophy develops students who are independent, self-managing, self-motivated, lifelong learners and problem solvers.



SPECIALIST SUBJECTS



Physical Education

Physical Education (PE) at Melrose Primary School focuses not only on teaching the fundamental motor skills, but also the importance of how physical activity can affect student's emotional and physical health. Teaching students that physical activity can alter their mood and brighten their day, all whilst having fun with their peers, is a focal point of all PE lessons.

At Melrose, we recognise the value of students not only participating in school PE sessions, but the pride and joy that comes with representing Melrose at sport outside of the school. As well as the whole school Cross Country, Athletics Carnival and Swimming Program, students have the opportunity to compete in inter-school sport including the Wodonga Winter Sports Carnival, Athletics, Cross Country, Kanga Cricket, Rugby League, League Tag and the Victorian State Team Trials in numerous sports.

Art

Visual Art is a valued learning area of the curriculum at Melrose Primary School, with students from Foundation to Year 6 taking part in specialist run sessions each week. The Visual Art program is designed to encourage children to be creative, innovative and successful learners, in a safe and supportive environment. Activities are designed to support and build upon the students' skills and knowledge and their appreciation of art. Tasks are usually open-ended, so students can work to the best of their ability and be proud of what they achieve.



LOTE - AUSLAN

Auslan involves communicating without speaking. To develop this, we act out the meaning of words either in small groups or individually. Students demonstrate scenes using stories, videos and books as prompts. They are involved in many activities that teach them to show expression with their faces or bodies, they demonstrate emotions through actions or stances, and depict the movements of living things eg. a cat stalking a bird. In this process students learn the Auslan sign for the words.



FOUNDATION STUDENTS



To start primary school, your child will need to turn five years old by 30 April in the year that they start school. Your child must be at school in the year that they turn six years of age. This is the compulsory school starting age.

It's good to plan ahead: **Melrose Primary School** starts taking enrolments, the year before your child is due to start school.

At Melrose, our Foundation Transition Program commences early in Term 2, the year before children start school. We pride ourselves on our commitment to working alongside pre-schools and early-childhood settings to develop a program that allows us to get to know our future students and give them insight into what teaching and learning looks like at Melrose Primary School.

Our dedicated team of Foundation teachers visit local pre-schools and early childhood settings to meet the children prior to the commencement of our "at school" transition program. Participating in our 4 session transition to school program and activities in Term 4 will help you and your child get a better understanding of what school will be like at Melrose.

Our program also provides scope for students to establish relationships with other children and to meet their teacher for the following year. We understand the range of emotions students and their families may have about starting school. Our transition program is designed to ease any anxieties and support a seamless transition into Foundation for your child.

We look forward to meeting you and your child and developing a strong partnership between home and school.



Investigations is the name given to the structured play based learning program undertaken in our Foundation classrooms at Melrose.

Through this program students are given the opportunity to explore open ended activities that link to their current classroom learning and align with the Victorian Curriculum.

Our Investigation stations, also known as "play invitations" are designed to engage and inspire our students to become motivated, thoughtful, courageous and empathetic learners who strive for academic excellence. At Melrose, we are driven by our philosophy of **"Educating Hearts and Minds"** and believe that providing our students with opportunities to engage in play-based learning assists in their holistic development.
